Lesson Plan:

Contour Study

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Fourth Grade

I. General Area of Investigation:

Contour/Value Study

A. Rationale: Students will create a contour of classmates. And create dimension by softly shading it.

B. Specific Objective: Learn and understand contour, how to observe details and learn value study.

C. Materials:

sharpie thin marker

Pencils blending stumps

Drawing Paper Scissors and glue

D. Time Span: approximately 4 weeks, classes at 60 minutes each.

II. Formal Qualities:

A. Elements: color, texture, shape, line

B. Principles: Balance, Symmetry

III. State Standards: Goal 26 A & B: I know how the arts are made 27 A & B: I can connect the arts to the past present and future.

IV. Resources

A. Examples of teacher contours and student contours.

V. Presentation of Lesson:

Teacher demonstrates contour line drawing by drawing a student. (Students are familiar with contour as they have already done a contour line study of a shoe.) Students will do their drawings and then show dimension by shading with an HB pencil and blending with a blending stump. The goal is to have 3 values in the blend. If applicable the students cut out their contours and fit them to each other to show overlapping, then glue them to a colored piece of construction paper.

VI. Criteria for assessment

- A. Students will follow the rules of contour:
- 1. Continuous line. Do not lift pen from paper (you can tell if they are doing this by observation and when you turn the paper over there should be little dots.
- 2. Eyes should be on the subject matter and not on the paper when drawing.
- 3. NO TALKING
- B. Students will present good craftsmanship.
