The annual Educators ArtLab, which will take place Sunday, July 20 through Friday, July 25, 2014, is a chance to get back to a college campus setting to revitalize your mind and refresh your thinking. ArtLab is free to high school art educators and includes on-campus housing, meals and materials as well as visits and receptions at local art museums and galleries. While the program is free for those selected to attend, transportation to and from Kansas City is the responsibility of each educator. Only those serious about attending should apply.

Summer Micro-Residency Art Program, June 22–28, 2014

Down deep you're an artist. You've been busy building lesson plans, grading projects, managing classrooms, meeting state guidelines, and nurturing young imaginations—and now it's time to tend to your own creative desires. Registration is now open!

Program

Educator-artists from a broad range of disciplines will live, work, and collaborate to push the boundaries of their practices. Faculty art and design mentors will guide resident artists through critiques, offer challenges, make presentations, provide demonstrations, and engage in one-on-one sessions. A public exhibition of individual and collaborative works culminates the experience.

Continuing Education Units

All participants will earn three total continuing education units: one for morning critiques and two for afternoon studio time with mentors.

Selection Criteria

Space is limited. The following selection criteria will be taken into consideration:

- *Full-time status at a public or private K-12 school
- *Passion for the proposed residency project
- *Compatibility with a faculty mentor

Fees

Application fee: \$50 (nonrefundable)
Program fee: \$285 (includes mentorship, five days/six nights in a single room, and meals)
Project supplies are the responsibility of each artist.

Applying

In addition to completing an online application, each educator should submit supporting material:

1. A brief description of your proposed residency project that outlines the ideas or concepts you will be exploring, the materials you'll need, and any tools and facilities that your project requires
2. A one-page biography with your current place of residence, a list of previous works, an indication of the media you specialize in, and links to any online galleries
3. Submit the online application with \$50 application fee by May 15, 2014.
4. Residency recipients will be announced by May 15, 2014.
5. Payment of the program fee must be made no later than June 1, 2014.

Program Costs

The program fee of \$250 covers three CEU credits, one week of on-campus residence, 12 meals, all supplies, and all costs related to local transportation, admission, and off-campus activities.

Alternatively, you may choose to live off-campus and attend as a non-residential participant for a fee of \$50, which does not include on-campus residence or meals.

Housing

Participants in the Educators' Summer Studio are assigned private rooms in CCAD's Design Square Apartments. Those choosing not to stay on campus will be issued a campus-parking pass.
